	2 Closed forest (Eucalyptus – dominated)	Closed tree layer (>40 % cover), tall trees, mostly Eucalyptus	eT3
	3 Open forest (Eucalyptus – dominated)	Closed tree layer (>40 %), medium trees (10-30m) mostly Eucalyptus	eM3
	4 Woodlands	Open Tree layer (10-30% cover), low trees (5-10m) with dominant grass or shrub layer	eL2
	5 Closed shrublands	Multi-stem shrub layer (20-40%) - dominance of Eucalyptus	eS2
	6 Open Shrublands	Multi-stem shrub layer (10-20%)	S2 – S1
	7 Grasslands with sparse shrubs (Acacia – dominated)	Open grassland with sparse shrub layer (<10%) – dominance of Acacia	wS1
	8 Swamp grasslands	Grasslands periodically flooded	G2-G3
	9 Croplands	Agriculture with some pasture	F3
	10 Bare soil	Very sparse vegetation (<5% cover)	F1 – G1
	11 Water	Water bodies	SL
	12 Cities	Urban settlements	UC
